14:15-14:45	<p>Ukraine in the Shadow of War: Humanitarian Consequences and the Work of People in NeedPeople in Need</p> <p>Russian aggression against Ukraine, ongoing since 2014, has caused massive destruction of cities and towns, the internal displacement of millions of people, and a deterioration in the psychological and social conditions of the population. The lecture will present the current humanitarian situation in Ukraine — the impact of the war on civilians' lives, the availability of basic services, and the needs in affected areas. It will also describe the work of the organization People in Need, which provides assistance both in Ukraine and in the Czech Republic through social and psychological counseling, material support, and help with education and integration of Ukrainian refugees, focusing on the most vulnerable groups.</p> <p>Registration HERE</p>

In this short, interactive workshop organized by the Centre for the Integration of Foreigners, you will try out the basic principles of effective communication with foreigners and discover that mutual understanding can be easier than it seems. The philosophy of the project is to foster a sense of belonging among people who have come to the Czech Republic from different parts of the world. The foundation of the program lies in diverse community activities where people can meet, share experiences, and practice the Czech language. These include, for example, conversation cafés, integration theatre, or the mask parade during the Velvet Carnival.
